

“Patience, Perseverance And The Lord’s Compassion” James 5:10-11

Misguided emotion is one of the greatest hindrances to believers in executing the experiential plan of God.

This miserable self-centered life of blaming others for our own faults, follows the dictates of an individual’s sinful nature; either toward self-righteous legalism in our area of strength or toward lascivious lawlessness in our area of weakness.

No believer has a right to say that because some other believer has committed a certain sin, that he’s not really saved.

No believer can fulfill God’s will for his life as long as he is in a state of fear or worry; a believer in constant unwarranted fear is a loser because he loses his capacity blessings for time and eternity but never his salvation.

A spiritually mature believer depends upon the integrity of God for every situation, rather than being limited to only one or two promises.

All promotions in the Christian life are completely fair because all promotion is accomplished by God and God alone.

Promotion in the plan of God is based on momentum from processed biblical truth and never from Christian service or good deeds.

As a result of God’s promotion, the quality and quantity of our production and service improve and our continued study of the Word of God motivates us to perform more good deeds and Christian service which produces higher promotion.
