

John 280 “Full Coverage Insurance Protection” John 17:8-13

The basis for our Lord’s High Priestly petition for glorification is not His perfect, sinless existence nor His unity with His glorious Father, it’s His work on the Cross that He will soon complete.

The Father is glorified in the proclamation of the Gospel of the finished work of His Son. *If there was even the slightest chance that we could be lost after our salvation, God would not have left us on earth at that time.*

Consider this: In spite of how unworthy we are, the Lord Jesus has chosen to share His acceptance with us and give us His place on earth to continue His ministry!

The disciples’ interim defeat does not hinder their eventual victory.

Jesus is praying for His love gifts that He received from the Father.

No one can truly give what doesn’t belong to them.

The disciples’ failure does not in any way, hinder the plan of God.

We may have failed God in a huge way but if we wake up after it’s all said and done, God still has a purpose for our lives, so we must therefore, get up and move on from it.

God intends for us to keep the transmission shift for our spiritual lives in drive with our foot on the gas pedal without any guilt complexes clogging up our fuel injectors.

Our fate is in God’s Hands and in His ability to keep or guard us and the great news is: He hasn’t lost one believer yet!

No matter how much we fail God, He will never fail us.

Since the Lord Jesus is: 1. Righteous; we as believers in Him share in His righteousness (2nd Cor 5:21); 2. Eternal life; we share His eternal life (1st John 5:11-13) and since our Lord has no sin and has paid for ours, we have no sin debt before God, (Rom 5:1).

We were elected and predestined in Him before the foundation of the world.

Our testimony isn’t all about what we gave up for Jesus, it’s about what He gave for us!

The Lord Jesus did not desert His disciples during His three year public ministry.
