When someone has a bad mental attitude in a certain point of time, it’s highly likely that they will keep on expressing it over many periods of time.

The general public hated Barabbas because they feared him and the religious Jews hated him because he didn’t kill for their religious cause but they’ll compromise and settle for him anyway!

Religion is so irrational that it chose Barabbas, the son of the father instead of Jesus, the Son of God the Father.
