“Are you ready to die?”

*Romans 8:35-37; Job 5:21-27*

**God daily sustains and supports all believers; providing fantastic living-grace-blessings above and beyond what’s required to keep us alive and He gives them to winners and losers.**

The impersonal love of God always emphasizes God as the subject, so the object of God’s impersonal love has no merit and the object of human impersonal love has no merit, so impersonal love becomes a major problem-solver.

*Because God has perfect integrity, He has infinite capacity for impersonal love toward the human race and*

*eternal capacity for personal love toward those with His perfect righteousness imputed.*

**No catastrophe or disaster in life is greater than God or the plan of God.**

For the mature believer, every catastrophe of undeserved suffering is an added blessing.

*We may fail God while we’re suffering but God never fails us in our suffering.*

In the greatest suffering in life, the mature believer still has the righteousness of God and he still receives blessing as a real imputation from the justice of God.

Dying-grace is believer’s experience of physical death in dying under the provision of grace where he has fantastic blessing and happiness in his death.

Dying grace is the experience of physical death under special blessing; a special provision of grace where dying is greater than living.

**The believer cannot die until the Lord is ready to take him home.**

Instruments of death cannot kill the believer until God’s plan calls for him to die.

*We are in union with Jesus Christ, sharing His eternal life,*

*His righteousness, His Sonship, inheritance, election, destiny and everything He has.*

Dying grace is the experience of physical death under special blessing; a special provision of grace where dying is greater than living.

This means minimum pain, maximum happiness, maximum soul stimulation, maximum use of biblical truth in the soul and maximum blessing so that dying becomes better than anything we had in life!

**In eternity past, under the divine decrees, God knew about each of us and He designed special blessings to give us the maximum that time and eternity have to offer but remember; they are also designed to glorify God to the maximum.**

Maximum glory comes to God by way of the fulfilment of His plan in our lives.

*The 1st category of blessings are the spiritual blessings of occupation with Jesus Christ and sharing the happiness of God the Father with biblical truth in our souls to meet every situation in life.*

In eternity past, we were seized and held by Christ Jesus, so we have these special

blessings from millions of years ago.

We live to reach greater-grace and we die to receive surpassing grace.
