

A Holy Week Special

From Palm Sunday to Easter

***“7 insults, 6 trials, 7 phrases of last words,
2 deaths, 3 miracles, 3 salvations and
1 magnificent God-man”***

Psalm 119:11 I have hidden Your word in my heart that I might not sin against You.

Only when our souls are fortified daily by learning the Word of God, can we have joy, stability and contentment while suffering.

Although Jesus couldn't leave His duty station on the Cross to do miracles, He could perform the greatest miracle: our salvation.

Thousands of people were saved when Peter preached but it was an indirect result of Jesus Christ's prayer on the Cross.

Man's greatest need is forgiveness and cleansing of sin and the penalty of sin is death, spiritual death.

He took our place, judged for our sins and today His prayer on the Cross is still being answered as many come to

Jesus Christ and receive Him as Lord and Savior!

Jesus never called Mary, mother; always woman, emphasizing that she was the mother of His humanity, but NOT the mother of God!

The 4th phrase indicated that He was being judged for us as God the Father poured out all of His wrath as a matter of justice upon the humanity of Jesus Christ as He bore the sins of the world.

As deity, Jesus Christ cannot be in the priesthood; but as a Man, He is the Royal High Priest.

No one has ever deserved salvation and there never will be anyone who deserves something as wonderful or precious as the blood of Jesus Christ, representing His spiritual death, which cleanses from all sin.

Jesus Christ was judged for our sins, bearing every sin that has been or ever will be committed.

The unbeliever has 2 mandatory appointments —to die physically and to stand before the Great White Throne to be judged for his works which he chose in preference to the work of Christ on the Cross.

The 7th phrase is the beginning of the end; yet the end is a new beginning; for Jesus would rise from the grave in resurrection body, walk among men for a short time, then ascend into the presence of the Father to sit at His righthand as our great High Priest and make intercession for us forever Heb 1:3; 7:25.

The animal on the altar bleeding to death is a representation rather than a true analogy to Christ's bearing our sins on the Cross.

Jesus Christ died twice so that we would only have to die once.

A miracle is an event in the physical world that surpasses all known human or natural powers and is ascribed to divine power as a supernatural phenomenon, not to be confused with extra-natural phenomena, often related to demonism.

God never performs miracles simply to relieve suffering or pain.

God assumes that once we have it in writing in the Bible, we're ready for the fact that instead of miracles, He intends for us to use our free-will every day, because the purpose and secret to life is what we have in our soul: His truth.

God split the veil of the Temple to indicate the barrier between man and God is removed by the work of Christ of the Cross.

In the case of a genuine resurrection, it's not necessary to open the graves.

The religious crowd at the Cross would have nothing to do with the Son of God but a Roman centurion, in command of all the troops on the hill, put the religious to shame.
